## USING THE INTERNET

At school you may use a computer. The computer can give you access to the Internet. The Internet is similar to a giant library and will allow you to look at many different things. You might also use a computer to make a Web site or send emails on the Internet. When you use a computer on the internet then these rules apply:

- Do not give out your name or your parents' names, your picture, telephone number, birthday or home address while you are using the Internet; also, never share passwords with any other student.
- Use the computer and Internet as instructed by your teachers. Use of the computer and Internet are for school-related purposes only.
- School rules and Code of Conduct apply when using the computer and Internet.

Remember that adults in your school may watch what you are doing on the computer. What you type and do on the computer is never private.

I have read the above rules and agree to follow them. If I do not follow these rules, I may lose my privilege to use the computer and Internet at school and there may be other consequences.
